Making a Will can help protect your loved ones and support the causes you care about after you die; ensuring your wishes are fulfilled as you choose. If someone dies without having a Will they are said to have died 'intestate', meaning your estate will be divided according to the law rather than your wishes.

What types of gifts can I include in my Will?

The most common types of gifts are:



Residuary gift – choose a percentage share of your estate to gift. *e.g.* 25% of your estate



Pecuniary gift – a fixed sum of money *e.g. £1,000*



Specific item – a particular item in your possession *e.g. house, car, jewellery*

Did you know?

Leaving a charitable gift in your Will can help to lower the amount of inheritance tax you could be liable to pay as gifts to charity are deducted before inheritance tax is calculated; if applicable.
