Travelling Abroad

If you require any vaccinations relating to foreign travel you need to make an appointment with the practice to discuss your travel arrangements at least 6 weeks before you travel.

Is there a GP crisis?

Latest estimates from Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP) and data suggest the UK needs an extra 8,000 GPs. There has been an increased demand on GPs in recent years making GPs struggle to deliver the care that patients need. This is due to an ageing population, an increase in the number of people with multiple long-term conditions, and the fact that GPs are being used to take strain away from hospitals.

ONLINE ACCESS

As of the 1st April 2019 all newly registered patients will be offered our online services to access their medical records.

This service will be available to our current patients who are signed up from 1st April 2020

Text Messaging service

We are now offering a text message reminder service where we will text you to remind you of your appointment time.

We can also text you if the Doctor or nurse wishes to see you, the text will ask you to contact the surgery to book an appointment.

Please ensure we have your up to date mobile number.

Home Visits

Whilst we encourage our patients to come to the surgery where we have the proper equipment and facilities available, we do appreciate this is not always possible. In this respect, if you do need a home visit, you can help us by calling reception **before 10.30.** You may only request a home visit if you are housebound or are too ill to visit the practice. Your GP will only visit you at home if they think that your medical condition requires it and will also decide how urgently a visit is needed. Please bear this in mind and be prepared to provide suitable details to enable the doctor to schedule house calls.

EXTENDED ACCESS HUBS

To help alleviate the pressure on local GP surgeries the Clinical Commissioning Group has introduced an extended hours access service at the following hubs. During the week the hubs are open 4.00-8.00pm and at weekends 9.00-4.00pm. Patient reports are favorable and we would encourage patients to make use of these appointments.
